What do you see as some of the most pressing issues in your community?

- Lack of opportunities, lack of employment, equality in the community

- For us, undocumented people the problems are many and asking for certain changes is difficult. We understand that. Go back to school. The children are at home and some parents will not be able to work. Christmas is going to be difficult.
- Encourage business to come to Pittsfield. We are filling up the city with stores that sell marijuana, but other stores are leaving. This makes me sad and scared because reflects how the economy is.
- Lack of employment and opportunities. Services are too expensive, for example, the
 internet, which at this time with the virtual school cannot stop being paid. High cost of
 living.
- Transportation

 what will happen, schools are closing again and for many families difficult times are
